George V. Soule Scholarship – 2010**

The Ruffed Grouse Society of Maine is pleased to offer a \$3000 scholarship to a deserving student who will be starting or continuing their education in the fields of Wildlife Conservation, Conservation Law Enforcement, Forest Management or a related field that is supportive of the broad goals of the Ruffed Grouse Society at both the regional and national level. The student must intend to become a practitioner in one of the above-mentioned fields, preferably in the state of Maine.

Requirements:

- **Must be a resident of Maine.**
- **Must have attended a secondary (High School) in Maine.**
- **Must already be enrolled in an undergraduate program or be enrolling for the upcoming fall semester.**

This scholarship is available to students either entering college or currently enrolled in a baccalaureate program, i.e., students who have successfully completed a portion of a 2 or 4-year program are eligible for these scholarships.

To apply for this scholarship, please complete the attached application. Also attach a copy of your high school transcript or college transcript for all semesters completed, as appropriate.

Telephone interviews may be conducted so please make sure you include an active telephone number and email address on your application.

The deadline for receipt of applications is Friday, April 9, 2010.

Note: Recipients shall not receive this scholarship until the committee receives a transcript of the grades for the semester completed. Recipients must be eligible and registered for the following semester, and earned a minimum of a 3.0 GPA (based on a 4.0 scale).
